Goals and Objectives

SWBAT understand the global impact of pollution in our oceans. (Dok 1)

SWBAT create a sea animal by using basic shapes then refining with details (DOK 4)

SWBAT create a sea animal drawing with dimension by using advanced colored pencil techniques. (DOk 4)

Learning Activities or Instructional Strategies

Students will come in and do their daily warm up. We will then view a PowerPoint presentation introducing them to the topic of pollution and its effect on sea life. Students will participate in a class discussion. Afterwards, we will each pick a sea animal and teacher will demonstrate how to draw the animals by breaking them into simple shapes and then going back in to refining and add details.

Students will spend several days drawing their animals. Then we will do a colored pencil skill building day before using colored pencils to add dimension to our sea animals. This will take a week or so.

Afterwards, we will paint our backgrounds and add our sea animal and various recyclable materials.
