Jane Goodall and Her Love of Nature

OVERVIEW

Students will study the life of Jane Goodall and how she made an impact studying chimpanzees. In this endangered species lesson students write in their journals and complete an online document presentation taking notes in Google Jamboards.

PHASES

OBJECTIVES	Students will:		
	Explore and research a woman from history and identify her key accomplishments.		
	2. Create an on- or offline project to tell the woman's story.		
	3. Share project with peers.		
MATERIALS	Materials:		
	Article on Jane Goodall		
	Interactive Jamboard		
	Books or other resources about the featured woman		
PROCEDURE	Lesson Procedure:		
	Prompt a class discussion inviting students to brainstorm what they know about the woman, such as who she is, her accomplishments, etc.		
	Show the article on the whiteboard or other display to the whole class.		
	3. Pause as needed to discuss the article.		
	4. Discuss the article in small groups		
	 Instruct students to open Assignments for the topic. Allow time for them to complete the assignments related to the topic. 		

PHASES

	6. Bring the class together. Ask students to brainstorm ways they can share the woman's story either on- or offline, such as a movie, a speech, a storybook, an obituary.	
	7. Students will highlight how Jane Goodall made a difference.	
	Allow time for students to work on their projects, providing help as needed.	
	9. Students share their projects with the class. After the presentations, prompt a class discussion about the effects of the woman's actions. How did she make a difference?	
ACTIVITY	Use google Jamboard to create notes on an article to show understanding and comprehension of the lesson.	
ASSESSENT	A rubric will be used to assess how students complete the project and article activity.
